July 19, 1934 - April 13, 2020

Anna “Ann” (Fucich) Mager, 85, of Penn Hills, passed away peacefully from natural causes surrounded by her daughters on the morning of Monday, April 13, 2020. She was born July 19, 1934 in Pittsburgh to the late George and Julia Churilla Fucich. Ann was a 1952 graduate of Mount Alvernia High School in Pittsburgh. She devoted her working career to AHERF (now known as AHN), starting at the business office at Columbia Hospital in Wilkinsburg and retiring 30 years later as the manager of data operations. She was a member of St. Bartholomew Parish in Penn Hills. Ann was the proud matriarch of her family, a dedicated caregiver, an avid gambler, and a fantastic cook. She enjoyed caring for her friends and family and found great joy in watching her great granddaughters. She will be remembered for her homemade spaghetti sauce and cinnamon bread. She was the beloved mother of Donna (Darryl) Chapman and Darlene (Doug) Cole; loving grandmother of Lauren (James) Zalin, Michael (Samantha) and Matthew Chapman, and Danielle and Jessica Cole; and adoring great-grandmother of Charlotte and Kinsley Zalin and Baby Boy Chapman. Ann is also survived by many nieces and nephews. 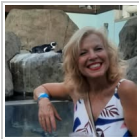
