Jack spent quality time in the service of his country. He served honorably in the U.S. Merchant Marines during WWII and the U.S. Navy during the Korean War. He was member of the Monroeville Municipal Planning Commission, the Police Pension Committee, and Treasurer of Monroeville Chamber of Commerce. He retired from A&B Smith as the Treasurer and Controller in 1984. Upon retirement he started his own accounting firm Jack Valentine & Co. where he retired in 2015. His namesake

company is still operated in Monroeville as Jack Valentine Associates LLC. He and his wife Pam left their home in Monroeville for a patio home in Bellevue Park of Cranberry to be close to their grandchildren. Jack and his wife Pam enjoyed many cruises and seeing the world together through travel. He loved his God, His family, and his United States of America having served them all well.
