Vivacious, direct but always charming, impeccably styled to the nines with perfectly coiffed hair, full makeup and well accessorized, she ran the show. Born December 13, 1928 in Fujian, she studied in Shanghai where she met her husband James. They emigrated to Taiwan in 1949. A natural entrepreneur, she ran successful businesses in Taipei. Gifted at languages, she spoke six: Fujianese, Sichuanese, Mandarin, Taiwanese, Japanese and English. In the late 1970's she, James, their three daughters and her parents emigrated to the United States to join their eldest daughter and her husband. It was Pittsburgh, PA that became their new home.

It was in Penn Hills that the Jade Garden restaurant became a landmark for 20+ years. It was here that she and "Jimmy" became fixtures in the community.
