He studied at Syracuse University (BS and Ph.D. in chemical engineering), and the University of Delaware (MS in chemical engineering), and led a distinguished career with Westinghouse and as a consultant with the Nuclear Utility Service Group. He worked in Pittsburgh and around the country on the design of naval nuclear reactors, as engineering manager of the Fast Flux Test Facility, project manager for the Clinch River Breeder Reactor, and president of the Westinghouse Hanford Company. Following his retirement in 1991, he served on numerous boards and committees including the Science and Technology Committee for Argonne National Laboratory, Review Committee for Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory, National Research Council, and the Bishop's Committee of the Catholic Diocese of Pittsburgh.
